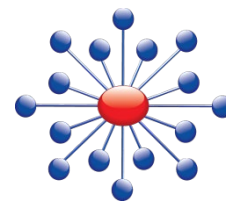

Meeting Purpose: The NIDA CCTN is convening stakeholders, experts, and federal staff to discuss and identify research and other efforts needed to continue to improve care for people with opioid use disorder and other substance use disorders in emergency settings. 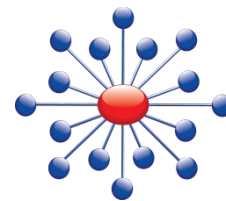
