

IMPLEMENTATION OF ED-INITIATED BUPRENORPHINE FOR OPIOID USE DISORDER

This presentation will feature the work of CTN-0069: Opioid Use Disorder in the Emergency Department (Project ED Health). Drs. Gail D'Onofrio and David Fiellin will share their study approach and results, and considerations for integrating implementation outcome evaluations in efficacy/effectiveness protocols.



Gail D'Onofrio MD, MS, is the Albert E. Kent Professor of Emergency Medicine and Professor of Medicine and Public Health at Yale School of Medicine. She is boarded in emergency medicine and Addiction Medicine. Dr. D'Onofrio is an independent NIH-funded physician-scientist with over two decades of experience designing and implementing clinical trials in the ED setting related to alcohol and drug use and is the PI of the New England Consortium Node for the NIDA Clinical Trials Network. She partners with multiple agencies regionally and nationally to change policies and introduce interventions to combat the opioid crisis.



David A. Fiellin, MD, is a Professor of Medicine, Emergency Medicine and Public Health at Yale. He directs the Yale Program in Addiction Medicine and is Vice Chief for Faculty Affairs, General Internal Medicine. He is an internal medicine physician and board certified in Addiction Medicine. He conducts research focused on improving access to treatment for unhealthy substance use in general medical settings including office-based practice, primary care, emergency departments, hospitals, and HIV specialty settings. Dr. Fiellin is Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Addiction Medicine and served as Co-Editor of the American Society of Addiction Medicine's textbook, *Principles of Addiction Medicine*, 4th, 5th and 6th Editions.
